Asian Journal of CLIL is an open-access, double-blind, peer-reviewed international academic journal, which is associated with the Japan CLIL Pedagogy Association (j-clil.com) and published online at Asian CLIL website (j-clil.com:publications). The journal welcomes contributions on the following research and teaching innovation in: CLIL, CBLT, CBI, bilingual education, immersion, IB, integrated learning, CLIL classroom research, CLIL assessment, and CLIL teacher education (praxis). Authors are encouraged to submit original articles that report on a teaching innovation in CLIL (Teaching Innovation Paper) and/or offer theoretical perspectives that contribute to fostering research on CLIL pedagogy in the local context (Research Articles). Asian Journal of CLIL aims to represent CLIL pedagogy and research in educational contexts in all of Asia, increasing the diversity and flexibility of integrated learning. We welcome contributions from all Asian countries.

Qualification to submit a manuscript:

- Those who are members of J-CLIL (<u>j-clil.com</u>).
- Those who are invited by the editorial board.
- In the case of multiple authors: The first author must be a J-CLIL member. All authors are encouraged to become members after their manuscript is accepted.
- *Those authors who are based outside of Japan* are exempt from the requirement to become members of J-CLIL but are encouraged to do so.

Submission Guidelines

Teaching Innovation Papers (*Qualitative or Quantitative*):

Word limit: **5000 words** including references Abstract: should be no more than 250 words

Research Paper:

Word limit: **7000 words** including references Abstract: should be no more than 300 words

The Asian Journal of CLIL primarily uses APA style (**7th edition**). Submissions are required to follow APA 7th edition standards and upon acceptance, a template will be provided for final formatting and submission.



Papers are published when they have been approved by the Board of Directors. Publications will be compiled to create an issue at the end of each year.
